Clarkson College has a signed articulation agreement with Metropolitan Community College (MCC). Students who complete an approved associate degree at MCC are guaranteed general admission into a corresponding baccalaureate degree program at Clarkson College.

By completing the Liberal Arts Transfer Associate in Science (LATAS) or Professional Health Studies Associate in Applied Science (PHAAS) degrees at MCC, students transfer 60 semester hours (90 quarter hours) as a direct transfer package into the Bachelor of Science in degree at Clarkson College. The following degree plan outlines the courses needed to complete this degree. The Bachelor of Science in Psychology degree may be completed in as little as four semesters.
