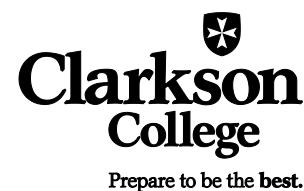

Clarkson College accepts transfer credit from University of Nebraska at Lincoln. The transfer guide shows how courses completed at University of Nebraska at Lincoln will be transferred to Clarkson College. It is important for students transferring credit to Clarkson College to submit a final official transcript after completing all course work from other institutions. Students must receive a grade of “C-” or higher to be considered for transfer credit. Clarkson College does not accept transfer credit for courses taken after enrollment at Clarkson College.

There are two program options (traditional and transfer) for the Associate of Science in Physical Therapist Assistant degree.

- **Traditional Option (6 semesters):** All courses may be taken at Clarkson College or equivalent from an accredited institution and are not necessary for application.
- **Transfer Option (4 semesters):** Must have the following courses from an accredited institution with a transfer grade of a “C” or higher completed: Human Anatomy with lab (4), Human Physiology with lab (4), English Composition I (3), Medical Terminology (1), College Algebra (3), Introduction to Psychology (3).

And one of the following:

Associate or higher-level degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher education

or

A minimum of 17 additional credit hours at an accredited institution with a transfer grade of a “C” or higher

Residency Requirement

Associate degree: At least 40 semester hours must be completed at Clarkson College for an associate degree.

Bachelor’s degree: At least 27 semester hours must be completed at Clarkson College for a bachelor’s degree.
